All Residents of PML are required to follow PMLA Rules & Regulations. The following are some "common violations." Please do your part to maintain a harmonious environment for all to enjoy.

Common Violations

Household Pets

- 1. Allowing your dog to run loose in the Common Area
- 2. Allowing your dog to bark incessantly
- 3. Allowing your dog to defecate in the Common Area

Personal Property

- 1. Allowing personal property to be stored outside your residence (out in the open)
- 2. Storing machinery or equipment out in the open without a construction permit
- 3. Accumulating junk on your Lot
- 4. Allowing your Lot to become unsightly
- 5. Allowing garbage to build up on your Lot
- 6. Leaving your garbage cans visible from the street on non-pickup days (unless in constructed container)

Parking and Vehicle Restrictions

- 1. Parking any vehicle, trailer or camper on the street (including shoulders)
- 2. Storing any non-operational vehicle on your Lot
- 3. Operating any unlicensed vehicle on the roadways (dirt bikes, go-carts, quads, etc)
- 4. Exceeding the posted speed limit or driving in a reckless manner
- 5. Following another through an access gate or allowing others to follow you through

Personal Conduct

- 1. Allowing loud music or other unreasonable noise.
- 2. Using skateboards, rollerblades, or scooters
- 3. Conducting any noisy activity during PMLA quiet time, before 7am and after 10pm
- 4. Uttering abusive language or conduct that would be offensive to a reasonable person
- 5. Conducting construction noises before 7am or after 7pm or anytime on Sunday
- 6. Having a garage sale
- 7. Cutting down a tree over 5" in diameter
- 8. Constructing any playhouse, tent or any other similar structure
- 9. Burning without Owner's burn permit number
- 10. Using golf course property for any activity other than golf (paid green fees)
- 11. Lighting fireworks is banned by Tuolumne County year round
- 12. Burning during our no-burn season (June 1 November 1)
